No more wrong numbers or wasted time trying to find the right person to call. A bilingual Information and Referral Call Specialist at 2-1-1 will help connect you to the service or information you need. All calls are confidential.

Everyone! Whether you need childcare, financial assistance for a utility bill, mental health counseling to help in a crisis or hundreds of other services, you'll find the answers you need by calling 2-1-1. In addition, 2-1-1 can help you find volunteer opportunities with numerous agencies throughout the community.

FAQ

What is 2-1-1?

2-1-1 is an easy to remember phone number that links callers to available health and human service programs. Whether you are a single mother needing food for your children or a senior citizen looking for home care, the United Way 2-1-1 Information and Referral program will help you find the resources you need.

What will United Way 2-1-1 do?

2-1-1 will deliver comprehensive information and referral services, free of charge to the caller, 24/7 by telephone and through the internet.

2-1-1 efficiently connects people in need with more than 1600 community resources. Information and Referral Specialists maintain a database of organizations and the programs/services they provide.

United Way 2-1-1 does not provide direct service in the forms of case management, counseling or social services.

Is United Way 2-1-1 a crisis hotline?

United Way 2-1-1 is not a crisis line. Individuals in immediate crisis should call 911 or the Suicide Prevention Hotline at 800-273-8255.

Who is eligible to call 2-1-1?

Any individual looking for information or referral assistance. Case managers, church leaders, employers, teachers, health professionals, employees or students are also welcome to call.

How does 2-1-1 help the community?

2-1-1 offers tremendous economic benefits to our region by identifying service gaps in the community. During times of disaster, 2-1-1 helps take non-emergency calls so 911 can more effectively concentrate on emergency calls.

How is United Way 2-1-1 funded?

Most of the funding for 2-1-1 comes from contributions to United Way of Weld County. Additional funds come from grants, municipalities, county and state contracts.
