CHALLENGES

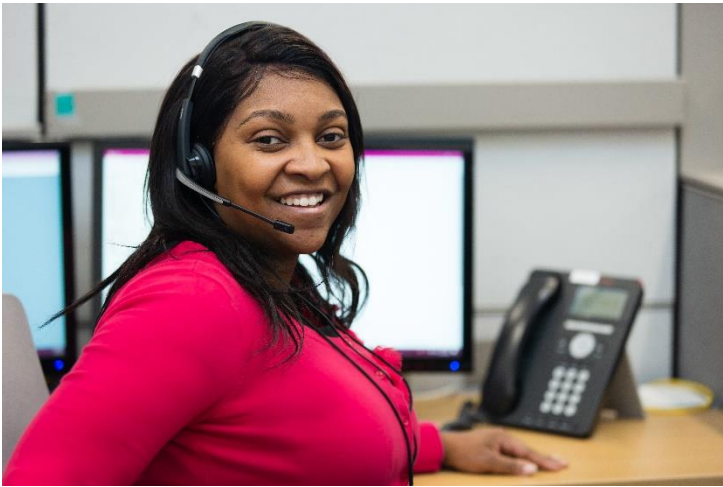
Over 324,000 people live in Weld County. 8% of residents live below the poverty line, and in Greeley, that rate jumps to 21%. 51% of the county’s children qualify for free or reduced lunches, and just 40% of fourth grade students are proficient readers. The housing vacancy rate continues to hover around its all-time low, and the median rent continues to increase. 64% of Weld County adults are overweight or obese, and only 22% of students get 60+ minutes of physical activity every day.

17% of adults report being mentally unhealthy at least half of the past month. We all face life challenges or have loved ones who can use a helping hand. When a person needs assistance with a livelihood emergency and doesn’t know where to begin, the network of human services can be overwhelming. Included in the 211 Colorado database there are...

- 140+ nonprofit organizations in Weld County
- over 300 programs and services across the county
- more than 3,000 nonprofit organizations in Colorado
- 8,000+ services across the state

211 Information & Referral is a free and confidential service that helps people across Colorado find the local resources that they need 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

INVESTMENTS

211 Colorado is a comprehensive information and referral service that connects users to an exhaustive listing of human service resources throughout Colorado. 211 for northeastern Colorado is provided by United Way of Weld County. It maintains an up-to-date database of human service agencies, programs and services in Kit Carson, Logan, Morgan, Phillips, Sedgwick, Washington, Weld and Yuma counties. 211 is available via phone call, text, live chat, web browser, and mobile phone app.

People seeking help access the 211 database online at www.UnitedWay-Weld.org/211, by calling 211 or by texting their zip code to 898-211. Trained specialists assist individuals, families and service providers who are seeking answers regarding community services in times of need such as rent and utility assistance, help finding food resources, adult and child day care options and more.

211 Colorado at United Way of Weld County also facilitates communication amongst agencies to troubleshoot social and human service challenges in northeast Colorado, assists in emergency situations, works to alleviate stresses on emergency management during disasters and identifies areas of greatest need and unmet needs.

In 2021, 211 Colorado at United Way of Weld County served 7,356 people looking for help.

In 2021, rent, utility assistance, housing, food, and shelter were the five highest needs of those contacting 211 in northeast Colorado.
