Weld's Way Home is decreasing the number of people that are living unsheltered. It includes 50+ organizations and invests in:

- offering cold weather and year-round emergency shelters
- providing case management for those hardest to house
- meeting rent and other basic needs for keeping families in their homes
- increasing transportation and homeownership options
- community-wide service coordination through Northern Colorado Continuum of Care
