ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW

Through the vision and support of United Way donors and volunteers, together we are building a better Weld County, one where:

OVERVIEW OF RESPONSIBLITIES

The Housing Navigation Center (HNC) is a resource center that provides services to people experiencing homelessness, helps people regain housing, and helps households in Weld County navigate local housing resources. As part of Weld's Way Home, Weld County's initiative to address and prevent homelessness, the HNC provides clear access to housing services ranging from homelessness prevention to sheltering. The person in this role will use a Housing First focus to assist in overnight shelter operations and tasks. They will work directly with people experiencing homelessness to provide a safe, effective, and welcoming emergency shelter.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Supervisor Duties

- Oversee and direct shelter associates during shifts and provide guidance to shelter policies and norms
- Report to shelter manager with updates and communicate with daytime and overnight staff
- Maintain change-over documents and facilitate staff communication

General Duties

- Work with people experiencing homelessness during shelter hours to provide a welcoming shelter environment, ensuring guest and staff safety, and providing guests with appropriate resources
- Manage overnight shift schedules at the shelter, including the ability/availability to fill in shifts when needed
- Perform shelter check-in/check-out responsibilities including completing intakes, assisting with meal service, preparing sleeping areas, handing out donations, and maintaining shelter cleanliness and organization
- Carry out HNC policies and procedures for overnight shelter activities including COVID-19 procedures, shelter safety policies, and general operational procedures
- Utilize trauma-informed de-escalation techniques to address guest concerns and mitigate conflict
- Maintain relationships among community partner agencies, key stakeholders, and the Weld
 County community to increase awareness of cold weather shelter resources and to maintain cold
 weather shelter stability
- Coordinate with the HNC staff to ensure seamless service delivery between daytime and nighttime operations

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- Assist in staffing extreme weather days during daytime shelter hours, when required
- Maintain neighborhood relationships around the HNC
- Participate in training around Housing First, Trauma-Informed Care, Mental Health First Aid, and other necessary topics
- Ensure data reporting through the Homelessness Management Information System (HMIS)
