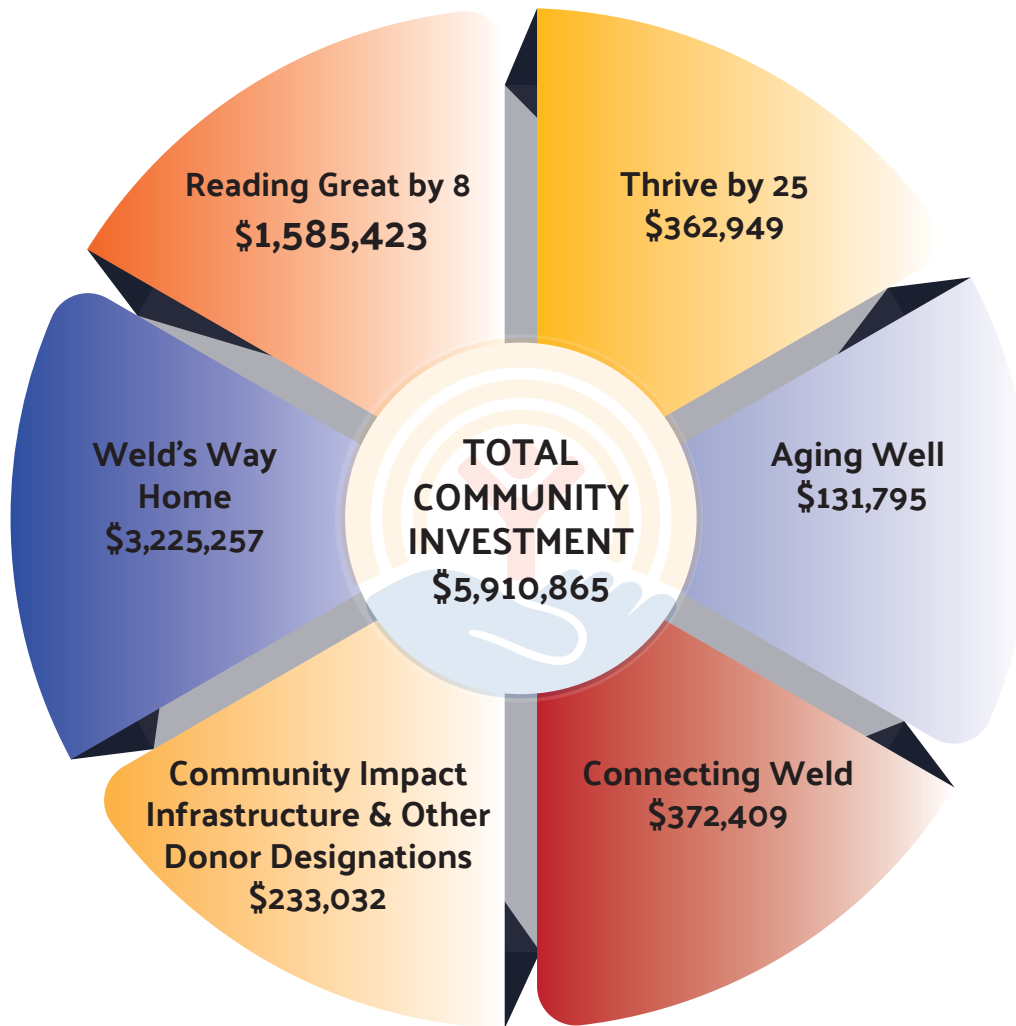

2024-2025 United Way Investments – Fund Sources

While the United Way of Weld County annual investment in community solutions is over \$5.9 million, three-fourths of this amount comes from foundation grants and government contracts that can only be spent on United Way-provided direct service and collective impact backbone activities. Given this, only 10% of total United Way internal program-related expenses are funded through community contributions. This means that the United Way board of directors is prioritizing programs at other organizations with your donations.
