United Way builds powerful partnerships to bring about lasting community-wide change.


This past year has been a turning point – a New Day for United Way of Weld County.

With deep gratitude and renewed excitement, we're proud to share the incredible progress we've made in the first year of our new strategic plan. Fueled by the support of generous donors, committed partners, and passionate volunteers like you, United Way is stepping boldly into a future rooted in connection, collaboration, and community-wide impact.

Our new strategic plan is more than a document – it's a community-driven roadmap for transforming how we support individuals and families across Weld County. Focused on cradle to career support and household stability, the plan embraces United Way's evolving role as a **convener, connector, and catalyst**. And already, we're seeing powerful outcomes.

Cradle to Career Support

- We helped match **2,403 four-year-olds with Universal Preschool** placements across the county, ensuring a strong start for Weld's youngest learners.
- We distributed a record-breaking **525,272 diapers** through the Covering Weld Diaper Bank, helping families stay healthy and employed.
- We invested over **\$1.5 million in local programs** dedicated to children and youth, supporting early learning, development, and meaningful connection.

Household Stability

- Our Housing Navigation Center provided overnight shelter to **382 guests**, totaling **9,986 nights** of safety and support.
- We directed more than **\$3.2 million** into housing and basic needs programs, helping individuals, families, and older adults regain and maintain stability.

Yet perhaps our most transformational work this year wasn't just in what we did – but how we're choosing to move forward. We transitioned a key direct service program, the **Northern Colorado Continuum of Care**, to a trusted partner, **Homeward Alliance**, allowing United Way to focus fully on its new role as a **Collective Impact Backbone**. In this role, we don't aim to do everything – we aim to bring everyone together to do what we each do best.

And the community response has been inspiring. Partners from across the region – nonprofits, businesses, local government, and residents – are showing up, rolling up their sleeves, and helping to shape the future of Weld County alongside us.

We know there is still much to do. But we believe in the power of coming together not just to talk – but to act. We're not stepping back. We're stepping up, uniting behind shared goals and pushing for solutions that will last.

United is the way to a thriving Weld County.



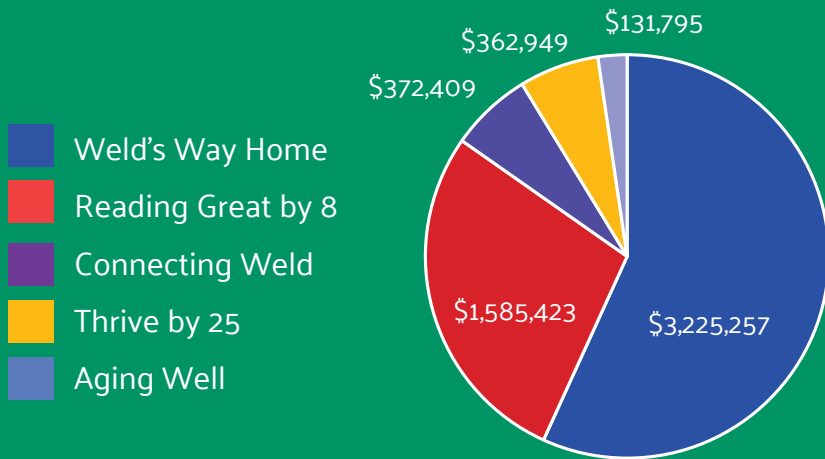

Building a strong early childhood foundation happens when a child's basic needs are met, child care providers know how to deliver high quality care and when a child's specific needs are addressed quickly.

United Way invests in programs such as the Early Intervention Program at Envision, and the Child Advocacy Center at Life Stories. Through programs like Colorado Tutoring Corps, we are helping young students increase their literacy skills and providing much needed support to families through the Covering Weld Diaper Bank. We also invest in programs that aid in capacity building and professional development for child care providers.

CRADLE TO CAREER

Supporting young people, especially those who are vulnerable, is crucial since the rational part of the brain isn't fully developed until around age 25.

United Way invests in programs such as the Youth Gardening Education Program at Brigit's Bounty Community Resource and Rebalance at Northern Colorado Youth for Christ. We invest in programs that offer mentoring and after school programs at the Boys and Girls Clubs, Partners and the Rodarte Center. We also provide scholarships for youth to participate in local recreation activities throughout Weld County.

Stable housing is essential for individual and family success. Having a permanent address improves physical and mental health, employment opportunities, addiction recovery and other outcomes.

United Way invests in programs such as the Domestic Violence Emergency Shelter at A Woman's Place, rental assistance programs at Almost Home and the Carbon Valley Help Center and the Mobile Food Pantry through Weld Food Bank. We also invest in multiple rent and housing assistance programs in Weld County.

HOUSEHOLD STABILITY

It's crucial for older adults to have the necessary support to age well in their chosen community. Age-friendly cities and towns enhance the quality of life for older adults and all residents.

United Way invests in programs that offer transportation, companionship and grief support through 60+ Ride, Meals on Wheels, Volunteers of America and the Community Grief Center. We also invest in local programs for life enrichment and neighborhood revitalization.



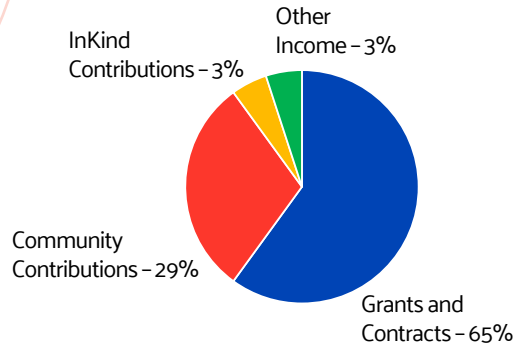

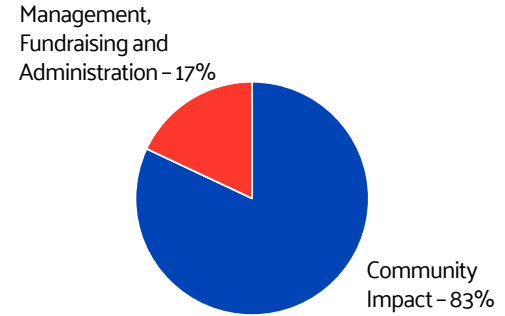

- Community Contributions are donations collected during the annual campaign, minus any pledges that aren't fulfilled.
- Grants and Contracts are funds that United Way secures and manages to meet local needs in Weld County. These funds support both direct service programs and broader collective impact work. Much of the funding comes from the state and federal government—funding that wouldn't come to the area without United Way's efforts.

- Community Impact includes funding for programs run by other organizations, services provided directly by United Way staff, support for collective impact efforts like Weld County's Early Childhood Council, and donor-directed contributions to specific agencies or programs.
- Management and Fundraising expenses are covered thanks to our generous Cornerstone Partners. Shared costs—like administration, IT, communications, and finance—are spread across the organization.
